
Students voted for new classroom names on Monday. Lower Division will now be rokála (Kookaburra) and Upper Division will now be mbwánda (Kangaroo).

We will celebrate NAIDOC Week in the first week of Term 3.





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
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

We have also been learning how to use pronouns, noun groups and identify and use prepositional phrases. In reading sessions, students have been learning strategies appropriate to their reading level and developing their fluency.

In mathematics, we have been completing a variety of engaging, hands-on


